Good Samaritan Class—This class is composed of couples and singles with elementary, high school and college-aged children. The class actively participates in discussion of Bible studies and various books on Biblical teachings facilitated by different members of the class. They are involved in “hands-on” ministries such as Macon Outreach, Centenary UMC Breakfasts, Habitat for Humanity, and Relay for Life. Social activities include “couples only” events as well as many activities which can be enjoyed by the whole family. Many members of our class are involved in helping to teach Sunday School for various age levels throughout the Church. (Room 216)

Fellowship of Believers—This class is composed primarily of young couples in their twenties and thirties, but singles as well as couples are welcome. The class is taught by several alternating class members and guest speakers who facilitate discussion on Biblical principles and the application to their daily lives. The class enjoys frequent social gatherings. (Room 213)

Glory Class—Is a class of singles and couples with school age and college age children. They have “Glory Gatherings” where the families come together for fellowship, food and fun. The curriculum focuses on Bible study in which they have relaxed and open discussions. They reach out to many families and friends in need at Christmas and throughout the year. (Room 212)

Victory Class—Is a diverse class whose ages range from 20’s to 50’s, singles and married couples. They are an energetic group who are serious about growing in their faith. They use a discussion format to explore how to live out their faith based on biblical principles. This sharing of life’s experiences strengthens each class member. Their mission outreach includes serving breakfast at Centenary UMC and sponsoring the Change for Jesus ministry. (Room 214)

Nan Freeman Class—This class is made up of a diverse age group of interesting people. Several of the class members share the responsibility of teaching. Biblical teachings on historical, theological and sociological basis applicable to everyday living are the focus of the lessons. The class sponsors families at Christmas, visits Shut-ins, and supports various missions and missionaries as well as Macon Outreach. They also host frequent social gatherings. (Room 133)

The John Wesley Class—This class is led by John Hiscox. He teaches in an educational and entertaining style from the Bible and other supplemental sources. Members are encouraged to participate and express their opinions. They are active in Rebuilding Together and are heavily involved in Habitat for Humanity. They are also known for their social gatherings. (Room 212)

The Francis Asbury Class—This class was started over 20 years ago as a class for young marrieds. Original members have now moved into their 50's but infusion of new members include those from their 20's and up, both couples and singles. It is devoted to several community-wide missions. Various class members lead lessons in a variety of topics, from Bible Study to books of noted Christian authors. Frequent socials almost always center around food. The class brags of having cooks second

to none. (Room 216)

Tom Johnson-Sadie Cheatham Class—This class is made up of the two original adult Sunday School classes at Martha Bowman Memorial UMC. Senior citizens comprise the group, but anyone is welcome. They meet in the library for easy access for handicapped persons. Lessons are presented each week by an excellent group of teachers. They are actively involved in Martha Bowman Church Blood Drives, Methodist Home for Children and Youth, Mulberry Outreach and Christmas Family Projects. (Library)

The Koinonia Class—Members of this class range in age from thirties to sixties. Lessons focus on various books of the Bible for two-three month studies. Several class members alternate teaching. Koinonia supports Rebuilding Together, Habitat for Humanity and other projects. They are also known for their lively social events. (Room 142)

The Genesis Class—A diverse group of seekers after a deeper understanding with lively and enlightening discussions in faith. They support a rice ministry to Macon Outreach and many donate time there and to the AIDS Ministry, Meals On Wheels, Grounds Maintenance, Sainly Stitches, the Altar Guild and other activities. They care greatly for and about each other and frequently find other times to be together—as in Roundtable at 6:30 p.m. on Sundays in Room 210. (Room 210)

Women At The Well—A caring, fun group of ladies of all ages and stages, married, widowed, divorced or single. The class studies a variety of biblically based subjects relative to their daily lives. They participate in numerous mission projects and enjoy a variety of different social activities. (Room 213)

Good News Class—This class was formed in 2002 as a Biblically-focused 9:30 Sunday School Class. Typical class topics range from studies of the various books of the Bible to lesson series by Ellsworth Kalas and James W. Moore. It is usually made up of couples in their 30's, 40's and 50's who live out their faith through their participation in serving breakfast at Centenary UMC, involvement in Jay's Hope, Macon Outreach and Relay for Life. Class meets on the lower level of the education building. (Room 016)

Friends of Faith—This class was formed in 2008 to offer more members the opportunity to get connected in a small group. Age ranges from the 40s to the 60s. We offer Biblically-based studies with a modern day application. An open discussion format provides everyone the opportunity to share and grow in the WORD.
